



RULES & REGULATIONS

- All classes and departments are open to entries from all counties and states except as specified. The exceptions are listed in the rules under the specific departments.
- The Fair Board reserves the right to disqualify and dismiss any exhibitor guilty of any horse-play detrimental to the best interest of the Fair.
- The Fair Board reserves the right to decline any entries that may be made and to disqualify any entry from participating after the entry is made.
- 4. Every animal and article upon the grounds shall be under the control of the Fair Board; and while every precaution will be taken for the safe keeping, neither the Association nor its officers or agents, will be responsible in any case for loss, damage, or accident that may occur.
- All awards will be placed according to merit by well-qualified judges whose decision will be final. The Fair Board will not entertain any contest of awards over the decision of the judges.
- 6. The Fair Board will pay premium money and prizes in accordance with the Premium Book and the award of the judges. Premium checks will be mailed within 60 days of the close of the fair. No premium checks will be available for pickup during the week of the fair.
- All exhibits entered in the Inter-State Fair for competition must remain on exhibit during the entire period of the Fair. Exhibitors violating this rule will forfeit all premiums or prize money.
- Ribbons will be awarded as follows: Livestock: First, blue; Second, red; Third, white; Fourth, pink; Fifth, yellow; Grand and Reserve, purple. Open Exhibits: First, blue; Second, red; Third, white; Grand and Reserve, purple. 4-H: First, blue; Second, red; Third, white; Grand and Reserve, purple.
- 9. All entries must be made in the name of the owner.
- Exhibitors should ascertain from Superintendents as to time the exhibits entered will be judged. An exhibit not presented

- promptly on scheduled time will be ruled out and debarred from competition in the class called. No complaint or protest on the grounds that the judge overlooked exhibits will be considered.
- 11. Each Superintendent will be in full charge of his/her department.
- 12. No claims for injury to any person or property shall be asserted nor suit instituted or maintained against the Montgomery County Fair Association, its officers, or their agents by or on behalf of any person, firm, or corporation of their agents, representatives, servants, or employees having licenses or privileges to exhibit on the fairgrounds or occupy any space thereon.
- 13. The Management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit, animal, concession, or show that may be falsely entered or may have any sign, banner or advertising of any kind which may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable by them without assigning a reason therefore.
- 14. At the close of the Fair, all exhibits must be claimed at once by the exhibitor or by parties representing the exhibitor. Those in charge will assume no responsibility for exhibits left on the fairgrounds after the closing day.
- 15. The Board of Directors of the Montgomery County Fair Association reserves to itself the absolute right to construe its own rules and regulations and determine arbitrarily any protests.
- Any complaints or protests shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Fair by the close of the Fair to receive any consideration.
- 17. Fire lanes must be kept clean and clear at all times. Vehicles, livestock trailers and travel trailers may be parked in designated areas only. The Fair Board reserves the right to have vehicles or trailers which are parked in undesignated areas towed away at the owner's expense.
- 18. Also see Rules and Regulations specific to each Division, Department, Category, and Class.



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

LIVESTOCK RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The Inter-State Fair is open to active 4-H and FFA members residing in Montgomery, Labette, and Chautauqua counties in Kansas and Craig, Nowata, and Washington counties in Oklahoma. The only eligible exhibitors will be those that nominate entries by the deadline. To meet age restrictions, applicants must not be 20 years old before September 1, 2019. The only eligible exhibitors for the market shows will be those that nominate entries by the deadline.
- A 2019 Inter-State Fair and Rodeo Livestock Show Entry Form must be completed and postmarked by July 15, 2019. Late entries will be accepted until July 25, 2019 with a \$20.00 LATE FEE. A nomination form is NOT an entry. If an entry form is not received, nomination is considered ineligible to show. Please provide correct mailing address and both parents names of each exhibitor on the nomination form.
- 3. All animals must be owned and cared for by the applicant. An applicant can nominate an UNLIMITED number per division but only TWO nominated animals can be shown per division.
- 4. In the event that any steer, barrow, sheep, or market goat applicant drops their project after May 15, 2019, another 4-H or FFA student cannot be substituted in his/ her place.
- All animals will be nominated by breed except market goats.
 Any animal nominated in the wrong breed as determined by the superintendent will be placed in the CROSSBRED class of that division. Any entries that do not have a breed specified will be entered in the crossbred class.
- 6. At least five entries will be required to make a single breed class. If any breed have less than five entries it will be placed in All Other Breed. All nominations must be made in one of the above breeds. No nominations can be made as AOB. Market steers and market heifers will require three entries to make a single breed class.
- All breeding stock MUST have a tag number, ear notch, or tattoo listed on entry form. Animals losing a tag must be reported immediately and retagged. Animals must have an ISFR tag at the time of weigh-in or may be ineligible to show and sent home. NO ANIMALS WILL BE TAGGED AT WEIGH-IN.
- Barns will open at noon on Sunday, August 11 for all market and breeding stock. All livestock entries must be in place by designated weigh-in/check-in time.
- Weigh-in schedule for livestock will be as follows on Monday, August 12:
 - Market Steers and Commercial Heifer 10:00 a.m. to Noon
 - Breeding Beef 10:00 a.m. to Noon
 - Rabbit and Poultry Check-in 12:00 p.m.
 - Market Broiler Weigh-in 2:00 p.m.
 - Goats 3:00-4:00 p.m.
 - Lambs 4:00-5:00 p.m.
 - Swine 5:00-7:00 p.m.
- Animals for exhibit purposes only will be accepted if space is available and stall fee paid. No decision on accepting these

- special animals will be made until after all regular entries have been assigned.
- 11. Tie-out time is from 8 p.m. to 8 a.m. All livestock must be in the barns or at the fair board designated tie-out. No cattle pens in the barns. All cattle must be tied.
- 12. All exhibitors furnish own bedding. No sawdust will be supplied.
- 13. Pens and stalls must be kept clean and neat at all times, and exhibitors must clean their pens/stalls following the conclusion of the fair. Failure to keep pens/stalls clean may result in being barred from the Market Livestock Sale and/or being barred from showing the next year.
- 14. Health and Fair regulations will be strictly enforced. All exhibitors must be prepared to comply with USDA requirements regarding implants or drugs. The Inter-State Fair reserves the right to blood and urine test any market animal.
- 15. Showmanship will be judged during the show with a call back for the top individuals in junior and senior age divisions. Prizes will be awarded to the top five in each age division.
- 16. Exhibitors must accompany their animals, care for them and be present to exhibit their entries. If an exhibitor has two animals in the same class, he or she, with prior approval of the superintendent, may have another exhibitor assist by showing that animal.
- Applicant must wear appropriate clothing while in the show ring.
 ALL SHIRTS MUST HAVE A COLLAR FOR JUNIOR MARKET SHOWS AND SHOWMANSHIP. No torn or ripped clothing and no ball caps.
- 18. No adults, except the judges and ISFR staff will be permitted in the show ring while the animals are being judged. Violation of this rule may disqualify the applicant.
- 19. There will not be a jackpot for any of the market shows.
- 20. The Grand Champion Barrow, Lamb, Market Goat, and Steer must sell. A maximum of 112 animals will be sold in the sale. An applicant is eligible to sell only one animal in each division. All animals sold through the Junior Market Livestock Sale must be slaughtered at a designated packer. The Montgomery County Fair Association will not be liable for any loss incurred during the 2019 Fair, shipping to the packer or due to the packer rejecting the carcass.
- 21. No glitter, adhesive, or paint will be allowed on premium sale animals.
- 22. All animals will be handled in a humane manner in accordance with the accepted animal husbandry practices. Any animal that dies must be removed from the premises immediately by the exhibitor.
- 23. All animals must be removed from all barns by 11:00 P.M. Friday, August 16, 2019. No exceptions.
- 24. Two (2) parking passes will be made available to each family exhibiting livestock. These passes will allow parking in the designated livestock parking lot only and may be picked up in the livestock office beginning at 9:00 a.m., Monday, August 12, 2019. Additional parking passes are available for \$20 each.
- 25. The ISFR Livestock Committee reserves the right to disqualify any applicant not complying with these rules and regulations

SPECIES RULES AND HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

GENERAL HEALTH

- All animals need to be individually identified by tattoo, metal ear tag, registration number, or breed association ear notch for swine. Please include all existing identification on health certificate.
- Animals with active lesions of ringworm or warts visible without close examination, or infested with mange, as determined by officials of the Animal Health Department or designated fair staff, will not be permitted to exhibit and must be immediately removed from the premises.

- 3. All tests must be conducted in a state-approved laboratory.
- All health papers must be presented when animals are checked and weighed in.

CATTLE

- 1. Will be weighed in on Monday, August 12 from 10 a.m. to noon.
- All animals must weigh at least 1100 pounds at weigh-in to be eligible for the premium sale.
- All steers or market heifers that make the premium sale must go to an approved locker. Oswego Locker, M & M Custom Butchering, McFerron Quality Meats, Cook's Processing, Peck's Custom Butchering, or Anderson Processing are approved lockers.
- 4. Three head are needed to make a breed. If three head are not present, the entry will be placed in the AOB class.
- All cattle, including bulls, must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of exhibit.

BRUCELLOSIS REOUIREMENTS

- Originate in and constitute a part of a certified brucellosis-free herd.
 Herd certification number must be entered on health certificate.
- 2. Originate from a USDA brucellosis-free classified state. No test required.
- Official calf-hood vaccinated animals of beef breeds under 24months of age and dairy breeds under 20-months of age may show without a brucellosis test. Vaccination tattoo symbol must appear on health certificate.
- Cattle not qualifying under 1, 2, or 3 must indicate a negative blood test for brucellosis in a State-Federal Laboratory in all animals over 18-months of age within 60 days of the show date.
- Out-of-State cattle must comply with Uniform methods and Rules for inter-state movement requirements according to classification of their state. Prior Kansas permit required from Texas. Test eligible age is 18-months for non-calf-hood vaccinated animals. For calfhood vaccinated animals, see #3 above.

TUBERCULOSIS REQUIREMENTS

Out-of-State cattle admitted for exhibition must meet one of the following classifications:

- 1. Originate in and constitute a part of a TB accredited herd. The TB accredited herd number must appear on the health certificate.
- 2. Originate from USDA classified "TB free" state.
- Cattle not qualifying under 1 or 2 must be tested negative to TB within 90 days of the show, except steers and calves under six months of age. NOTE: Kansas, Oklahoma or Iowa cattle are not required to be TB tested.

SWINE

- 1. All swine will be weighed in on Monday, August 12 from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Unload at the west gate of the hog barn only. Health papers will be checked before you are allowed to unload.
- All swine must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of exhibit. The certificate will be examined by personnel of the Animal Health Department or designated show staff prior to unloading swine. Health Certificates must certify that:
 - All breeding swine over six months of age must have a negative brucellosis test within 60 days or originate from a validated herd; validation number shall appear on the health certificate.
 - All swine originating from a stage IV or V state do not require a pseudo-rabies test. Note: Kansas and Oklahoma swine meet the state IV or V requirements for pseudorabies and therefore, do not require a test. Swine originating from a state that does not qualify are to have a negative serum neutralization test for pseudo-rabies within 30 days prior to entry and herd or origin shall have no pseudo-rabies within 12 months or originate from a qualified pseudo-rabies free herd. Qualified pseudorabies free herd numbers shall appear on the health certificate. Swine which have been vaccinated for pseudorabies will not be allowed to enter Kansas. Offspring of vaccinated swine are allowed as long as tested negative for pseudo-rabies within 30 days of entry using the serum neutralization or latex test.



- 3. All pigs and their ISF tag must be clean at the time of weigh-in.
- 4. Barrows must weigh a minimum of 200 pounds to show and 220 pounds to be eligible for the sale.

SHEEP

- Lambs will be weighed in on Monday, August 12 from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- All sheep must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of exhibit. All exhibitors please leave official health certificates in the sheep superintendent's office. The certificates will be examined by personnel of the Kansas Animal Health Department or designated show staff.
- 3. All lambs must weigh a minimum of 90 pounds to show. Lambs must weigh a minimum of 100 pounds to be eligible for the sale.
- 4. Lambs must be slick shorn with even length of wool covering above the hock and knee. Wool length should not exceed 0.2 inch. Lambs with excessive or uneven wool cover will not be weighed or checked in until shorn.
- All lambs must have a scrapies tag.
- 6. All lambs cannot have their yearling teeth up and in wear at the time of the fair. Any lamb, which in the opinion of the official mouther, having their permanent incisors up and in will be excluded from entry in the show.
- 7. Have your local veterinarian examine your sheep for sore mouth and fungus infection.
- 8. All sexually intact (ewes and rams) must be identified with an official USDA premise ID Tag. This includes Market Ewe lambs and Wether Dams. Questions: 785-296-2326.

GOATS

- 1. Meat goats will be weighed in on Monday, August 12 from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- All goats must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of exhibit. Exhibitors please leave official health certificates in the goat superintendent's office. The certificates will be examined by the superintendent.
- 3. All goats must weigh a minimum of 50 pounds to be eligible for sale.
- 4. All meat goats need to be slick shorn at time of weigh-in.
- 5. All meat goats must have scrapies tag.
- 6. All goats cannot have their yearling teeth up and in wear at the time of the fair. Any goat, which in the opinion of the official mouther, having their permanent incisors up and in, will be excluded from entry in the show.
- 7. No TB or Brucellosis test required.
- 8. All sexually intact (bucks and does) must be identified with an official USDA premise ID Tag. Questions: 785-296-2326.

MARKET BROILERS

- 1. Market Broilers will be weighed in Monday August 12, 2019 at 2:00 pm. Exhibitor needs to be present to weigh-in.
- 2. Chickens should be purchased by June 1, 2019 from Coffeyville Feed and Farm. Purchase 6 or 12 birds, best three to make up your pen.
- 3. Must have wing bands in place matching purchase records at time of show.
- After birds are officially weighed, they cannot be removed from the assigned cage.
- 5. Any bird showing signs of disease will not be allowed on the fairgrounds.
- USDA Wholesome Meat Act applies to ALL Market Birds. Only animals eligible for immediate slaughter may be brought on the grounds to exhibit.
- 7. Ideal weight 6lb per bird live weight at weigh-in. Birds will be judged on uniformity of weight, shape, type, and fleshing.
- 8. Interstate Fair and Rodeo will in no way be liable or responsible

- for the condition of carcass or sale price of animals.
- 9. The Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Market Broiler Pens will qualify for the Junior Livestock Sale.
- Market Broiler Show is open to youth who are active members of 4-H or FFA residing in Montgomery, Labette, and Chautauqua counties in Kansas and Craig, Nowata, and Washington counties in Oklahoma.

LIVESTOCK FITTING CONTEST

CONTEST WILL BEGIN AT 8:00 PM ON MONDAY, AUGUST 12, 2019

RULES

- Teams will consist of three 4-H and/or FFA members. There will be a junior and senior division. Exhibitors may move up a division but cannot move down a division.
- 2. \$20.00 entry fee. Entries due by Monday, August 12 at 12:00 pm.
- 3. No adult help allowed.
- 4. Contestants must furnish their own supplies.
- 5. Steers or heifers may be used. Calf must be clean/dry by 7:30 pm.
- Team members must be exhibiting livestock at the Inter-State Fair and Rodeo.
- 7. Entry fees will all go back to a payout of 50%/30%/20%.

LIVESTOCK JUDGING CONTEST

COORDINATOR: Keith Martin

CONTEST WILL BEGIN AT 9 A.M. ON FRIDAY, AUGUST 16, 2019

CONTEST OBJECTIVES

- 1. To measure the students' knowledge in the following categories:
 - A. To make accurate observations of livestock.
 - B. To determine the desirable traits in animals.
 - C. To make logical decisions based on these observations.
 - D. To discuss and defend their decisions for their placing.
- To develop the ability to select Livestock that will provide increased economic returns to producers, as well as meet the needs of the industry and consumers.
- To become proficient in communicating in the terminology of the industry and the consumer.
- 4. To identify the criteria used in marketing livestock.

RULES

- Teams will consist of 3 or 4 members from the same school or 4-H group. If a team has 4 members only the three highest total scores will be counted. Team ties will be broken on the 4th member's total score. If still tied the next tie breaker will be team reasons.
- Individuals that are not on a team will be entered in the individual contest.
- 3. There will be no talking during the contest. Individuals caught talking will be given 1 warning then the card for that class will be pulled and contestant will receive a 0 for that class. There will be no cell phones allowed during the contest. Coaches will not be allowed in the arena or while classes are being judged.
- 4. There will be six classes of 4 animals in each class to be judged, 2 classes of each species, one set of oral reasons will be given for each species for a total of 3 sets of oral reasons.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

POULTRY SHOW RULES

All birds must be in place by noon, Monday, August 12, 2019. Judging will be held Wednesday, August 14, 2019 beginning at 1 p.m. All birds must be removed from barn from 11 a.m. - 2 p.m. Friday, August 16, 2019.

- Entries must be entered online or postmarked by July 15, 2019. No late entries accepted, no substitutions.
- 2. Entry Fee is \$3.00 per bird and \$5.00 for a Broiler Pen.
- All birds must be certified pullorum-typhoid clean (see health requirements) All birds must be clean and free of parasites.

- 4. Any birds deemed unhealthy will be removed from the showroom.
- 5. Only show officials or owners will be allowed to handle birds or remove eggs.
- 6. Birds entered as cockerels or pullets must be under one year old. Birds over one year old must be entered as cocks or hens.
- 7. There will not be any classes for production or meat type chickens. This is a pure breed poultry show only.

MARKET BROILER RULES

- Market Broiler show is open to youth who are active members of 4-H or FFA residing in Montgomery, Labette, and Chautauqua counties in Kansas and Craig, Nowata, and Washington counties in Oklahoma.
- Birds are to be purchased by June 1, 2019 from Coffeyville Feed and Farm. Purchase 6 or 12 birds, best three birds to make your pen. Only one pen of Market Broilers per exhibitor. Birds will have a wing band when purchased and will need to have wing band in place matching purchase records to be eligible to show.
- Market Broilers will be weighed in Monday August 12, 2019 at 2:00 p.m. Exhibitor needs to be present to weigh-in. Each pen of three will be weighed only one time for official weight.
- 4. Entries must be postmarked by July 15, 2019.
- 5. After birds are officially weighed, they cannot be removed from the assigned cage.
- Any bird showing signs of disease will not be allowed on fairgrounds. USDA Wholesome Meat Act applies to All Market Birds. Only animals eligible for immediate slaughter may be brought onto the grounds to exhibit.
- 7. The Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Market Broiler Pens will qualify for the Junior Livestock Sale. This is a terminal sale for all market qualifiers. All Junior Livestock Sale competition requirements apply to qualifying Market Broiler pens. Exhibitors who make the sale are required to be present during the premium sale.

Ideal weight for Marker Broilers is 6 lb. per bird live weight at weigh-in. Birds will be judged on confirmation, fleshing, finish, uniformity of birds within the pen, and absence of defects.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

All poultry, except waterfowl, must show proof that they are pullorumtyphoid clean by one of the following methods:

- Originated from a U.S. pullorum-typhoid clean flock as evidenced by an official VS form 9-3 certifying all birds in the flock over 4 months of age have had negative test for pullorum-typhoid within the past year.
- Present evidence that the entries were purchased from U.S. pullorum- typhoid clean source and have been either the only poultry on the premises of the owner or have been physically separated from the other flocks.
- Present an official VS form 9-2 signed by an official testing agent showing that the entries have had a negative result from a pullorum- typhoid test conducted within 90 days prior to the fair. The sealed leg band number of the bird(s) must appear on the form.



Cream Cheese), raw eggs, flavored oils, "canned" bread or cakes in a jar, cut fresh fruit or any food requiring refrigeration will be disqualified and not judged. Refer to K-State Research and Extension Publication, 4H488, Judge's Guide for Food and Nutrition Exhibits, or call the Extension for more information. Further Clarification: If cream cheese or sour cream (or anything considered a dairy product) is mixed into the entire batter and baked sufficiently, it does not require refrigeration and will be allowed. If the dairy product (cream cheese, etc.) is in a filling, then it is not considered baked in with the dry ingredients and remains moister, therefore requiring
- refrigeration and will NOT be allowed.

 4. Alcohol (ex. Wine, beer and hard liquor) is not allowed as an ingredient in food entries. Entries with alcohol in the recipe will be disqualified and not judged.
- Recipes are required for all food product exhibits including box mixes. Products without recipes will be discounted one ribbon group.
- 6. Food exhibits should be in food grade plastic bags, disposable plastic containers or boxes and placed on paper or foam plates or foil covered cardboard. Container will not be judged.


