## LIVESTOCK RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Inter-State Fair Market Shows are open to active 4-H and FFA members of Neosho, Montgomery, Labette, and Chautauqua counties in Kansas and Craig, Nowata, Rogers, and Washington counties in Oklahoma. To meet age restrictions, applicants must not be 20 years old before September 1, 2026 .
2. The only eligible exhibitors in the market class will be those that nominate entries by May 15, 2026. An unlimited number of animals can be nominated but only two can be shown per species in the market class. Any 4/H or FFA animal previously sold through a premium sale, ribbon auction, or similar event WILL be allowed to show in the market class at Inter-State Fair and Rodeo.
3. Grand and Reserve Grand Champions from each species MUST go through the premium sale and those animals WILL BE TERMINAL. All other sale animals may be taken home by exhibitors to be slaughtered or shown again. If an exhibitor has both Grand and Reserve Grand Champion, they will only be allowed to sale the Grand Champion. Reserve will be released to go home.
4. Grand and Reserve Grand Champion animals become property of the Montgomery County Fair Association, and a fair market value will be posted on the day of weigh-in. All Grands and Reserve Grands will go to one locker chosen by the livestock committee. If Owner wants to retain carcass it will be owners' responsibility to get with the livestock committee before the start of the premium sale.
5. All Grand and Reserve Grands must get pictures taken at the backdrop after their show.
6. The Inter-State Fair Breeding Shows are open to applicants that are not older than 20 years of age before September 1, 2026.
7. Animals exhibited in the breeding classes are required to be registered in the names of the exhibitor or in the family name and registration papers must be presented at the time of entry, except in the commercial classes.
8. ALL nominations and entries will be done online. Nominations must be completed by May 15, 2026. ALL entries must be completed by July 25, 2026.
9. Barns will open at noon Sunday, August 9, 2026, for all livestock. All livestock must be in place by designated weigh-in/check-in time.
10. Weigh-in/check-in schedule for livestock will be as follows on Monday, August 10, 2026  
Swine – 8:00 am to 10:00 am  
Bucket Calves – 10:00 am to 11:00 am at show ring.  
Cattle – 10:00 am to 12:00 pm  
Rabbit and Poultry Check-in – 8:00 am to 12:00 pm  
Market Broiler Weigh-in – 1:00 pm Exhibitor must be present.  
Goats – 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm  
Lambs – 4:00 pm to 5:00 pm
11. NO PARKING AROUND BARNES
12. Tie out time is from 8:00 pm to 8:00 am. All livestock must be in the barns or at the fair board designated tie-outs. No cattle pens in the barns. All cattle must be tied.
13. All exhibitors furnish their own bedding. No sawdust will be supplied.
14. No wire is allowed for mounting fans. Metal fans can not touch metal panels.
15. Pens and Stalls must be always kept clean and neat. All exhibitors MUST clean their pens /stalls following the conclusion of the fair. Failure to keep pens/stalls clean may result in being barred from the Market Livestock Sale and/or being barred from showing the next year.
16. Health and Fair regulations will be strictly enforced. All exhibitors must be prepared to comply with USDA requirements regarding implants or drugs. The Inter-State Fair reserves the right to blood and urine test any market animal.
17. Exhibitors agree to read and comply with all the current Kansas Health Rules and Regulations. All livestock must be individually identified by an official USDA-approved ear tag, breed registration tattoo or tag, or breed association ear notch for swine. Any animal showing evidence of infectious or contagious disease or sickness will be removed from the fairgrounds. The decision of the superintendent will be final in this matter.
18. Exhibitors must accompany their animals, care for them and be present to exhibit their entries. If an exhibitor has two animals in the same class, he, or she, with prior approval of the superintendent, may have another exhibitor assist by showing that animal, if that exhibitor is enrolled in the same species.
19. Exhibitors must wear appropriate clothing while in the show ring. No torn or ripped clothing, no t-shirts, and no ball caps.
20. Showmanship will be judged in a separate class with a call back for the top individuals in junior, intermediate, and senior age divisions. Juniors will be 10 and Under, Intermediate will be 11 to 14, and Senior will be 15 and up. Age will be determined as age on the day of the show. Prizes will be awarded to the top five individuals in each age division. No entry fee to enter. Exhibitors must show their own animal.

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21. No adults, except the judges and ISFR staff will be permitted in the show ring while the animals are being judged. Violation of this rule may disqualify the exhibitor. Exhibitors only in holding pens.
22. No dogs allowed near the show ring.
23. Market animals will be used for livestock judging contest unless ISF Superintendent is notified by showman or parent that their animals are not to be used before contest.
24. The Montgomery County Fair Association will not be liable for any loss incurred during the 2026 fair.
25. All animals will be handled in a humane manner in accordance with the accepted animal husbandry practices. Any animal that dies must be removed from the premises immediately by the exhibitor.
26. Non-Sale animals are released starting Friday, August 14, at 12:01 am to 11:00 am. All animals must be removed from all barns by 11:00 pm Friday, August 14, 2026. NO exceptions.
27. The ISFR livestock committee reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor not complying with the rules and regulations.
28. Two parking passes will be made available to each family exhibiting livestock. These passes allow parking in the designated livestock parking lot only and may be picked up in the livestock office beginning at 9:00 am, Monday, August 10, 2026. Additional parking passes are available for \$20.00 each.
29. In the event a market animal loses its tag between nomination and the fair, there will be a form available online to fill out and email to the livestock committee.

## HEALTH REGULATIONS

### General Health

1. All animals are subject to examination by the superintendent and shall be free of clinical signs of infectious and contagious disease.
2. Animals determined by fair staff that have not met listed requirements will not be permitted to exhibit.
3. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection**  
-Kansas Origin Livestock – CVI is not required  
-livestock originating from other States – All livestock originating outside of Kansas must meet Kansas import requirements.
4. All animals need to be individually identified by an approved official ID on a health certificate. All market livestock MUST also have approved ISF tag number listed on CVI for those animals that need a CVI.
5. Swine entering the state of Kansas requires an entry permit number prior to shipment.
6. In addition to the general requirements, animals must be:
  - Be free of any signs of "sore mouth".
  - Be free of apparent infection and contagious disease.
  - Be free of signs of active fungal (ringworm) infection, warts, or infestation of mange.

## LIVESTOCK FITTING CONTEST

Coordinator: Madison Simmons

Contest will begin at 6:30 pm on Tuesday, August 11, 2026

### Rules

Teams will consist of three 4-H and/or FFA members. \$20.00 entry fee. Entries are to be made Monday, August 10, 2026 by 5:00 pm.

1. No adult help allowed.
2. Contestants will have 30 minutes.
3. Steers or heifers may be used. Calf must be clean and dry by 6:15 pm
4. Team members must be exhibiting livestock at the Inter-State Fair and Rodeo.
5. The teams will be judged based on the following criteria:  
Knowledge  
Abilities: fitting of legs, tail, body  
Equipment used.  
Final appearance of the animal  
Showmanship
6. Teams must furnish their own equipment and materials used to fit their animals. Calves may be provided by a sponsor.
7. Entry fees will all go back to a payout of 50%/30%/20%

## LIVESTOCK JUDGING CONTEST

Contest will begin at 9:00 am on Friday, August 14, 2026

### Contest Objectives

To measure the students' knowledge in the following categories:

- A. To make accurate observations of livestock
  - B. To determine the desirable traits in animals
  - C. To make logical decisions based on these observations.
  - D. To discuss and defend their decisions for their placing.
1. To develop the ability to select livestock that will provide increased economic returns to producers, as well as meet the needs of the industry and consumers.
  2. To become proficient in communicating in the terminology of the industry and the consumer.
  3. To identify the criteria used in marketing livestock.

### Rules

1. Teams will consist of 3 to 4 members from the same school or 4-H group. If a team has 4 members only the three highest total scores will be counted. Team ties will be broken on the 4<sup>th</sup> member's total score. If still tied the next tie breaker will be team reasons.
2. Individuals that are not on a team will be entered in the individual contest.

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- There will be no talking during the contest. Individuals caught talking will be given 1 warning then the card for that class will be pulled and contestant will receive 0 for that class. There will be no cell phones allowed during the contest. Coaches will not be allowed in the arena or while classes are being judged.
- There will be six classes of 4 animals in each class to be judged, 2 classes of each species, one set of oral reasons will be given for each species for a total of 3 sets of oral reasons.

Show will be Tuesday, August 11, 2026, following market swine show.

- Proper registration papers for each animal need to be provided.
- Premiums will be awarded in each of the following breeds: Berkshire, Chester White, Duroc, Hampshire, Poland China, Spot, Yorkshire, Commercial and AOB
- Each breed will constitute a class. Breed must be shown on entry form.
- At least four entries will be required to make a single breed class. If any breeds have less than four entries, it will be placed in AOB.
- All breeding stock MUST have a tag number, tattoo, or ear notch listed on entry form.

- Animals with lesions of ringworm, fungus, sore mouth, warts, or infested with mange will not be permitted to exhibit.
- Premiums will be awarded in each of the following breeds: Dorset, Hampshire, Montandale, Shropshire, Southdown, Suffolk, AOB Wool Breeds, and AOB Meat Breeds.
- At least four entries will be required to make a single breed class. If any breeds have less than four entries, it will be placed in AOB.
- All animals in lamb classes must be carrying all their lamb teeth.

## Bucket Calves

Bucket calf check in will be Monday, August 10, 2026, from 10:00 am to 11:00 am at the show ring. Bucket calf show will be Thursday, August 13, 2026, interview portion will be at 4:00 pm and the showmanship portion will begin at 6:00 pm.

1. Exhibitors are limited to one entry. Pre-entry required by July 15, 2026. There is no entry fee for Bucket Calves.
2. Calves must be born between January 1 and June 1 of the current year. They must have been purchased within two weeks of birth and not exceed 500 pounds at the time of the show. A bucket calf is an orphaned or newborn calf, fed on bucket or bottle.
3. All male calves must be castrated to be eligible to show.
4. All calves must have an ear tag for identification.
5. Exhibitors must be 5 to 10 years old (age as of Jan 1) of the current year. Please include the age of exhibitor on entry form.
6. Class will be split if number warrant.
7. Placing will be based on exhibitor general knowledge, general health of calf, showing ability, and herdsmanship.
8. Beef or dairy quality will not be considered.
9. A winner will be announced at the end of the show.
10. If an exhibitor is showing in any other beef division, they are ineligible to show a bucket calf.

### JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW AND SALE RULES

1. In addition to the following rules exhibitors are subject to the livestock rules and regulation listed on page 1-2.
2. If any steer, swine, sheep, or goat applicants drop their project after May 15, 2026, another 4-H or FFA member cannot be substituted in his/her place unless it is a family member listed on the nomination form. An unlimited number of animals can be nominated but only two can be shown per species in the market classes.
3. All animals must be nominated by breed except market goats. Any entries that do not have a breed specified will be entered in the crossbred class.
4. 4-H and FFA members will show in the same classes. NO separate classes exist for 4-H and FFA in the Livestock Division of the Fair.
5. The only eligible exhibitors for the market shows will be those that nominate entries by May 15, 2026. NO EXCEPTIONS
6. Junior members of the Junior Market Livestock Sale are limited to one steer, one lamb, one meat goat, one swine per exhibitor in the Market Livestock Sale, to be held at the close of the Inter-State Fair and Rodeo.
7. The Livestock committee retains the right to adjust the number of sale entries. The sale order will be determined by the respective judges.
8. Exhibitors must be in the show ring when his or her animal is sold unless they are attending a state 4-H or FFA competition AND prior approval by the livestock committee has been granted.
9. Exhibitors making the sale will need to pick up their sale shirt Friday, August 14, 2026, starting at 3:00 pm. ALL exhibitors making the sale will need to be at the sale ring at 4:00 pm for mandatory picture.
10. Neither the Montgomery County Fair Association nor members of the Sale Committee make any representation or assume any responsibility concerning any animals entered in the fair and sale.
11. Grand and Reserve Grand Champion animals become property of the Montgomery County Fair Association, and a fair market value will be posted on the day of weigh-in. All Grands and Reserve Grands will go to one locker chosen by the livestock committee. If Owner wants to retain carcass it will be owners responsibility to get with the livestock committee before the start of the premium sale.
12. In no event may the animal be repurchased by the seller.
13. NO glitter is allowed on the sale animals.

## Market Beef

Coordinator: Todd Hayes

Weigh-In will be Monday, August 10, 2026, from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm.  
Show will be Thursday, August 13, 2026, at 8:00 am

1. Market beef must be tagged on or before May 15, 2026, with an ISF tag. An online nomination including pictures must be submitted by May 15, 2026. All animals must weigh at least 1100 pounds at the weigh-in time on the entry day of the fair to be sale eligible.
2. Calves entered in this project must be steer calves and may be Angus, Charolais, Chi, Hereford, Limousin, Maine Anjou, Shorthorn, Simmental, or Crossbred of any of the beef breeds. These steers do not need to be registered.
3. Market heifers will need to be nominated. This will be eligible for the premium sale and will have the same rules as the market steers.
4. If the number of steers warrants, the animals may be divided into weight classes to facilitate judging. Market steers and market heifers will require three entries to make a single breed class.

1. Market swine must be tagged on or before May 15, 2026, with an ISF tag or 840 EID with an identification number. An online nomination including pictures must be submitted by May 15, 2026.
2. Swine entered in this project can be barrows or gilts and may be Berkshire, Chester White, Duroc, Hampshire, Poland China, Spotted, Yorkshire, and Crossbred. Animals should be farrowed on December 1, 2025, or after.
3. All animals will be nominated by breed. Any animal nominated in the wrong breed as determined by the independent classifier will be placed in the CROSSBRED of that division.
4. At least four entries will be required to make a single breed class. If any breed has less than four entries, these entries will be entered as All Other Breeds. If the number of head warrants, the animals will be divided into weight classes to facilitate judging.
5. All swine must weigh 220 pounds to be eligible for sale.
6. All market swine and ear tags must be clean before they can be weighed in.

2. Only healthy rabbits are to be exhibited. Any rabbit that exhibits parasites or has evidence of disease will be sent home by the superintendents.
3. Cage assignments will be on a first come, first-served basis.
4. Exhibitors may enter either the open or the youth class (only one). Open: Exhibitor any age, Youth: Exhibitor must be 18 years or younger.
5. Exhibitors are responsible for the care of their animals and keeping the cages clean.
6. The Montgomery County Fair Association will not be responsible for loss from any cause.
7. Feed and water will be furnished by the Montgomery County Fair Association.
8. Removal of animals before official release means forfeiting all awards.
9. The show is open to all exhibitors. Exhibitors must be present prior to show time.

Show will be Wednesday, August 12, 2026 at 1:00 pm. All poultry may be removed from the barn Friday, August 14, 2026, from 8:00 am to 11:00 am or by appointment with coordinator.

1. All birds must be certified pullorum-typhoid clean. All birds must be clean and free of parasites.
2. Any birds deemed unhealthy will be removed from the fairgrounds.
3. Only show official or owners will be allowed to handle birds or remove eggs.
4. Birds entered as cockerels or pullets must be under one year old. Birds over one year old must be entered as cocks or hens.
5. There will not be any classes for production. This is a pure breed poultry show only.

### HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

All poultry, except waterfowl, must show proof that they are pullorum-typhoid clean by one of the following methods:

1. Originated from a U.S. pullorum-typhoid clean flock as evidenced by an official VS form 9-3 certifying all birds in the flock over 4 months of age have had a negative test for pullorum-typhoid within the past year.
2. Present evidence that the entries were purchased from the U.S. pullorum-typhoid clean source and have been either the only poultry on the premises of the owner or have been physically separated from the other flocks.
3. Present an official VS form 9-2 signed by an official testing agent showing that the entries have had a negative result from a pullorum-typhoid test conducted within 90 days prior to the fair. The sealed leg band number of the bird(s) must appear on the form.
